
NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(ST HELENS ROAD, ORMSKIRK, WEST LANCASHIRE BOROUGH)
(REMOVAL OF PEDESTRIAN CROSSING)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to remove a Toucan Crossing in St Helens Road, Ormskirk, from a point 5.5 metres south of its junction with the centreline of Moor Street for a distance of 24.5 metres in a southerly direction.



Statement of Reasons

The purpose of this proposal is to revoke a controlled crossing at the junction with St Helens Road and Moor Street, Ormskirk. The crossing was constructed in July 2023 however the crossing was never made into general operation due to safety concerns raised upon the signing off procedure. Following investigation into reported near misses within the assessment stage, the consensus was to decommission the crossing due to risks created from the installation. The equipment can be re-used and installed elsewhere in the district of Ormskirk.
