ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The County Council of the County Palatine of Lancaster in exercise of their powers under section 72(3) and section 73(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the County Palatine of Lancaster, and with the consent of the Minister of Transport, hereby order and direct as follows:-

1. Each of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order shall become a restricted road for the purposes of section 71 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.
2. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. This Order may be cited as The County Council of Lancaster (Restricted roads)(No. 6) Order 1969 and shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of August, 1969.

SCHEDULE

1. That length of road (B5269) known in part as Cumeragh Lane and in part as Whittingham Lane at Whittingham, in the Rural District of Preston, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, which extends from a point 330 yards west of the junction of Whittingham Lane with Beacon Drive, in a general easterly direction to a point 445 yards south east of the junction of Cumeragh Lane with Bleasdale Road, a distance measured along the said length of road of approximately 2020 yards.
2. That length of Church Lane (Class III) at Whittingham, in the Rural District of Preston, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, which extends from its junction with Goosnargh Lane (Class III) in a south-easterly direction to its junction with Whittingham Lane (B5269), a distance measured along the said length of road of approximately 500 yards.

3. That length of Goosnargh Lane (Class III) at Goosnargh, in the Rural District of Preston, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, which extends from a point 720 yards north west of its junction with Church Lane (Class III) in a south-easterly direction to its junction with Mill Lane, a distance measured along the said length of road of approximately 785 yards.
