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ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF LANCASTER
(RESTRICTED ROADS)(NO. 7) ORDER, 1969

The County Council of the County Palatine of Lancaster in exercise of their powers under section 72(3) and section 73(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the County Palatine of Lancaster and with the consent of the Minister of Transport, hereby order and direct as follows:-

1. Each of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order shall become a restricted road for the purposes of section 71 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967.
2. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. This Order may be cited as the County Council of Lancaster (Restricted Roads)(No. 7) Order 1969, and shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of August, 1969.

1. That length of Chapel Lane (Class III) at Longton in the Rural District of Preston, in the County Palatine of Lancaster which extends from a point 135 yards east of its junction with Avalwood Avenue, in a south-easterly direction, to its junction with the Longton By-Pass (A59) a distance measured along the said length of road of approximately 710 yards.
2. That length of Chapel Lane (Class III) at Longton in the Rural District of Preston, in the County Palatine of Lancaster which extends from a point 125 yards west of its junction with South Avenue, in a south-westerly direction, to its junction with the Longton By-Pass (A59), a distance measured along the said length of road of approximately 820 yards.
