## NOTICE OF PROPOSAL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (NEW SCOTLAND ROAD, HOLME STREET AND LEEDS ROAD, NELSON, PENDLE BOROUGH) (PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS)

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a parallel zebra crossing in the following locations:

- a) New Scotland Road, Nelson, from its roundabout junction with Leeds Road for a distance of 36 metres in a northerly direction;
- b) Leeds Road, Nelson, from its roundabout junction with New Scotland Road/Holme Street for a distance of 32 metres in a north easterly direction;
- c) Holme Street, Nelson, from its roundabout junction with Leeds Road for a distance of 32 metres in a southerly direction;
- d) Leeds Road, Nelson, from its roundabout junction with New Scotland Road/Holme Street for a distance of 35.5 metres in a south westerly direction.
