
NOTICE OF PROPOSAL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (MARKET STREET, COLNE, PENDLE BOROUGH) (REMOVAL AND INTRODUCTION OF PEDESTRIAN CROSSING)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to:

- a) Remove a zebra crossing in Market Street, Colne, from a point 18 metres east of its junction with the centreline of Market Place for a distance of 21.5 metres in an easterly direction.
- b) Introduce a toucan crossing in Market Street, Colne, from a point 8.5 metres east of its junction with the centreline of Market Place for a distance of 40 metres in an easterly direction.



Statement of Reasons

The purpose of the proposed order is to support the improved amenity in Colne Town Centre, with improved pedestrian access and linkage around Colne. The uncontrolled zebra crossing along Market St will be replaced by a traffic-controlled Puffin crossing giving pedestrians a safer crossing facility.
