## NOTICE OF PROPOSAL HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (BLACK BULL LANE, PRESTON, PRESTON CITY) (ROAD HUMPS)

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce speed cushions in the following locations:

- 1) Black Bull Lane, Preston, from a point 67.1 metres north east of its junction with the centreline of Conway Drive for a distance of 3 metres in a north easterly direction;
- 2) Black Bull Lane, Preston, from a point 110 metres south of its junction with the centreline of Queens drive for a distance of 3 metres in a south westerly direction;
- 3) Black Bull Lane, Preston, from a point 58.7 metres south east of its junction with the centreline of Queens Drive for a distance of 3 metres in a south westerly direction;
- 4) Black Bull Lane, Preston, from a point 87.1 metres north of its junction with the centreline of Queens Drive for a distance of 3 metres in a northerly direction;
- 5) Black Bull Lane, Preston, from a point 65.8 metres south west of its junction with the centreline of Ingle Head for a distance of 3 metres in a south westerly direction;
- 6) Black Bull Lane, Preston, from a point 17.2 metres south west of its junction with the centreline of Ingle Head for a distance of 3 metres in a south westerly direction.

The speed cushions will have a maximum height not exceeding 75mm.
