Something to do this week! Review your EYPP

All children deserve to have an equal chance of success regardless of their backgrounds and this is where the Early Years Pupil Premium funding can play a pivotal role. The additional funding can be used effectively and creatively to support and narrow the gap in learning and development for disadvantaged children.

Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) and who can claim it was extended in April 2024. Families need to meet economic criteria and give consent to enable settings to claim this additional funding which is claimed through the eligibility checking system on the free entitlement portal. A great use of your funding would be for some professional development to ensure all staff have the following skills:

1: Quality of adult-child verbal interactions.

- Do adults in the setting carry out back and forth interactions?
- Are they seen as playful partners?
- Do they give children thinking time?
- Are they down at the child's level?

2: Understanding the curriculum.

- Are staff confident with and have a secure knowledge of the settings curriculum and the Educational Programmes that support this?
- Do all staff know their key children's starting points, prior experiences, and next steps?

3: Knowledge of how young children learn.

 Are staff confident with child development? What about any newer members of staff?

4: Adults' skill in helping children to resolve conflicts.

- Have staff received appropriate training to support children who may have suffered Adverse Childhood Experiences and trauma?
- Do staff know every child's backstory? Are staff confident to support these children?

5: Helping parents to support children's learning at home.

• How does the setting support and engage parents from induction and throughout the year?

We are shouting a big Wednesday Well Done to all those settings who were inspected last week or who had their inspection reports published.

Last week inspection reports captured how well settings in Lancashire get to know their families and children well – and how this impacts greatly upon emotional wellbeing and positive relationships.

They noted that ...

- "Leaders and staff know their families and community exceptionally well. They direct families to services when required. They also use additional funding well to support families. For example, the pre-school organises family-focused activities and days out. Children benefit from enhanced well-being, stronger relationships at home and increased confidence."
- "Staff know children extremely well. Children form very positive bonds with staff. Children enjoy peaceful and nurturing moments with staff where they watch clouds together and discuss the different patterns and shapes in the sky. It is evident that children are happy and feel emotionally secure at the nursery."
