## NOTICE OF PROPOSAL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (NOOK CRESCENT, NOOK GLADE AND PRESTON ROAD, GRIMSARGH, PRESTON CITY) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 202\*

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 to the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a prohibition of waiting in the following lengths of road:

- a) Nook Crescent, Grimsargh, both sides, from its junction with the centreline of Preston Road for a distance of 15 metres in an easterly direction;
- b) Nook Glade, Grimsargh, both sides, from its junction with the centreline of Preston Road for a distance of 16 metres in a southerly direction;
- c) Preston Road, Grimsargh, the east side, from a point 7 metres north of its junction with the centreline of Nook Crescent for a distance of 12 metres in a southerly direction.
