


THE LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(A675 HOGHTON LANE, HOGHTON/WALTON-LE-DALE AND STATION ROAD, HOGHTON,
CHORLEY BOROUGH AND SOUTH RIBBLE BOROUGH)
(50MPH AND 30MPH SPEED LIMITS) ORDER, 1993.

The Lancashire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 82(2), 83(2) and 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour along the A675 Hoghton Lane, Hoghton and Walton-le-Dale, from a point 137 metres east of its junction with Bells Lane to a point 25 metres southeast of the summit of Hoghton Bridge, a distance of 1.4km.
2. The full length of Station Road, Hoghton, from its junction with A675 Hoghton Lane to its junction with A675 Hoghton Lane shall become a restricted road for the purposes of Section 81 of the Act.
3. This Order may be cited as "The Lancashire County Council (A675 Hoghton Lane, Hoghton/Walton-le-Dale and Station Road, Hoghton, Chorley Borough and South Ribble Borough) (50mph and 30mph Speed Limits) Order 1993 and shall come into operation on the 20th December, 1993.

THE COMMON SEAL of the Lancashire County Council was hereunto affixed in pursuance of a Resolution passed at a meeting of the Highways and Transportation Committee duly convened and held on the 9th September, 1992.
