

THE LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

(BANNISTER LANE, BANNISTER GREEN AND WRENNALL'S LANE, ECCLESTON AND HESKIN, CHORLEY BOROUGH) (RESTRICTED ROADS) ORDER, 1994.

Lancashire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 82(2) and 83(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order may be cited as "The Lancashire County Council (Bannister Lane, Bannister Green and Wrennall's Lane, Eccleston and Heskin, Chorley Borough) (Restricted Roads) Order 1994 and shall come into force on the 4th July, 1994.
- The lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be restricted roads for the purposes of Section 81 of the Act.

THE COMMON SEAL of the Lancashire County Council was hereunto affixed in pursuance of a Resolution passed at a meeting of the Highways and Transportation Committee duly convened and held on the 12th January, 1994.

## SCHEDULE

- Bannister Lane, Eccleston, from a point 20 metres south of its southerly junction with Woodhart Lane to its junction with Wrennall's Lane, a distance of approximately 190 metres.
- Bannister Green, Heskin, from its junction with Wrennall's Lane for a distance of 120 metres in a southerly direction.
- 3. Wrennall's Lane, Eccleston, for its entire length.
