## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

## (PLEASANT STREET AND WESTBY STREET, LYTHAM ST ANNES, FYLDE BOROUGH) (PROHIBITION OF LOADING (25-26 NO2C)) ORDER 2025

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that on 25 November 2025 Lancashire County Council made the above Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 to the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a prohibition of loading and unloading in the following lengths of road:

- a) Pleasant Street, Lytham St Annes, the east side, from its junction with the centreline of Westby Street for a distance of 16 metres in a southerly direction;
- b) Pleasant Street, Lytham St Annes, the west side, from its junction with the centreline of Westby Street for a distance of 16.5 metres in a southerly direction;
- c) Westby Street, Lytham St Annes, the south side, from its junction with the centreline of Pleasant Street for a distance of 12.6 metres in an easterly direction;
- d) Westby Street, Lytham St Annes, the south side, from its junction with the centreline of Pleasant Street for a distance of 22 metres in a westerly direction.

This Order will come into force on the 08 December 2025.
