

NOTICE OF MAKING
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(VARIOUS ROADS, HYNDBURN BOROUGH) (REVOCATION OF BUS
STOP CLEARWAYS) ORDER 2026

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on 08 January 2026 Lancashire County Council made the above Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to revoke the following:

- a) "The Borough Of Hyndburn (Bus Stops)(Clearway) Order 1999" in full;
- b) "The Borough Of Hyndburn (Bus Stops)(Clearway) Order 1978" insofar as it relates to a bus stop clearway in the following lengths of road:
 - i. Church Street, Accrington, both sides, for its entire length;
 - ii. Fairfield Street, Accrington, both sides, for its entire length of road;
 - iii. Manor Place, Church, both sides, for its entire length of road;
- c) "The Borough Of Hyndburn (Infant Street, Accrington)(Bus Stops)(Clearway) Order 1980" insofar as it relates to a bus stop clearway 7am - 9am in Infant Street, Accrington, both sides, for its entire length.
- d) "The Borough Of Hyndburn (Peel Street, Accrington)(Bus Stops)(Clearway) Order 1983" insofar as it relates to a bus stop clearway 7am – 9am in Peel Street, both sides, for its whole length together with the full width of the adjoining bus station.

This Order will come into force on the 19 January 2026. LSG4/894.21413/AFR. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
