

**NOTICE OF MAKING**  
**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**  
**LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL**  
**(HOLME SLACK LANE, PRESTON, PRESTON CITY) (REVOCATION  
AND PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2026**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that on 14 January 2026 Lancashire County Council made the above Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to:

1. Revoke the (Lancashire County Council (Preston Area) (On Street Parking Places, Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Consolidation Order 2009" insofar as it relates to Item (226)a of schedule 10.01.
2. Introduce a prohibition of waiting in the following lengths of road:
  - a) Holme Slack Lane, Preston, both sides, (bus turning circle) from a point 91 metres north west of its junction with the Centreline of Ronaldsway for a distance of 56 metres in a north easterly then westerly direction;
  - b) Holme Slack Lane, Preston, the north east side, from a point 91 metres north west of its junction with the Centreline of Ronaldsway for a distance of 37 metres in a north westerly direction.

This Order will come into force on the 26 January 2026. **LSG4\894.20870\AFR.** Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
