


NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(DERBY STREET WEST, ORMSKIRK, WEST LANCASHIRE BOROUGH)
(PEDESTRIAN CROSSING)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a two stage puffin crossing in the following lengths of road:

- a) Derby Street West, Ormskirk, the east bound carriageway, from its junction with Southport Road for a distance of 42 metres in a south easterly direction;
- b) Derby Street West, Ormskirk, the west bound carriageway, from its junction with Church Street for a distance of 29.3 metres in a north easterly direction.



Statement of Reasons

A controlled crossing is proposed to increase the safety of pedestrians (particularly vulnerable young children or less mobile elderly pedestrians) crossing the carriageway. The crossing is proposed within close proximity to the nearby local amenities because of the subsequent increase in the number of pedestrians wishing to cross the carriageway at this location.
