**THE LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL  
(WHALLEY NEW ROAD, BILLINGTON, RIBBLE VALLEY BOROUGH)  
(REVOCATION AND RESTRICTED ROAD) ORDER, 1999.**

The County Council of Lancashire, in exercise of its powers under Sections 82(2), 83(2) and 84(1) and (2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. The length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be a restricted road for the purposes of Section 81 of the Act.
2. The speed limit imposed by this Order shall take precedence over any 40mph speed limit imposed by any Order which may have been made before the coming into force of this Order insofar as it relates to the length of road referred to in Article 1 of this Order.
3. This Order may be cited as "The Lancashire County Council (Whalley New Road, Billington, Ribble Valley Borough) (Revocation and Restricted Road) Order 1999 and shall come into force on the 30<sup>th</sup> November 1999.

**SCHEDULE**

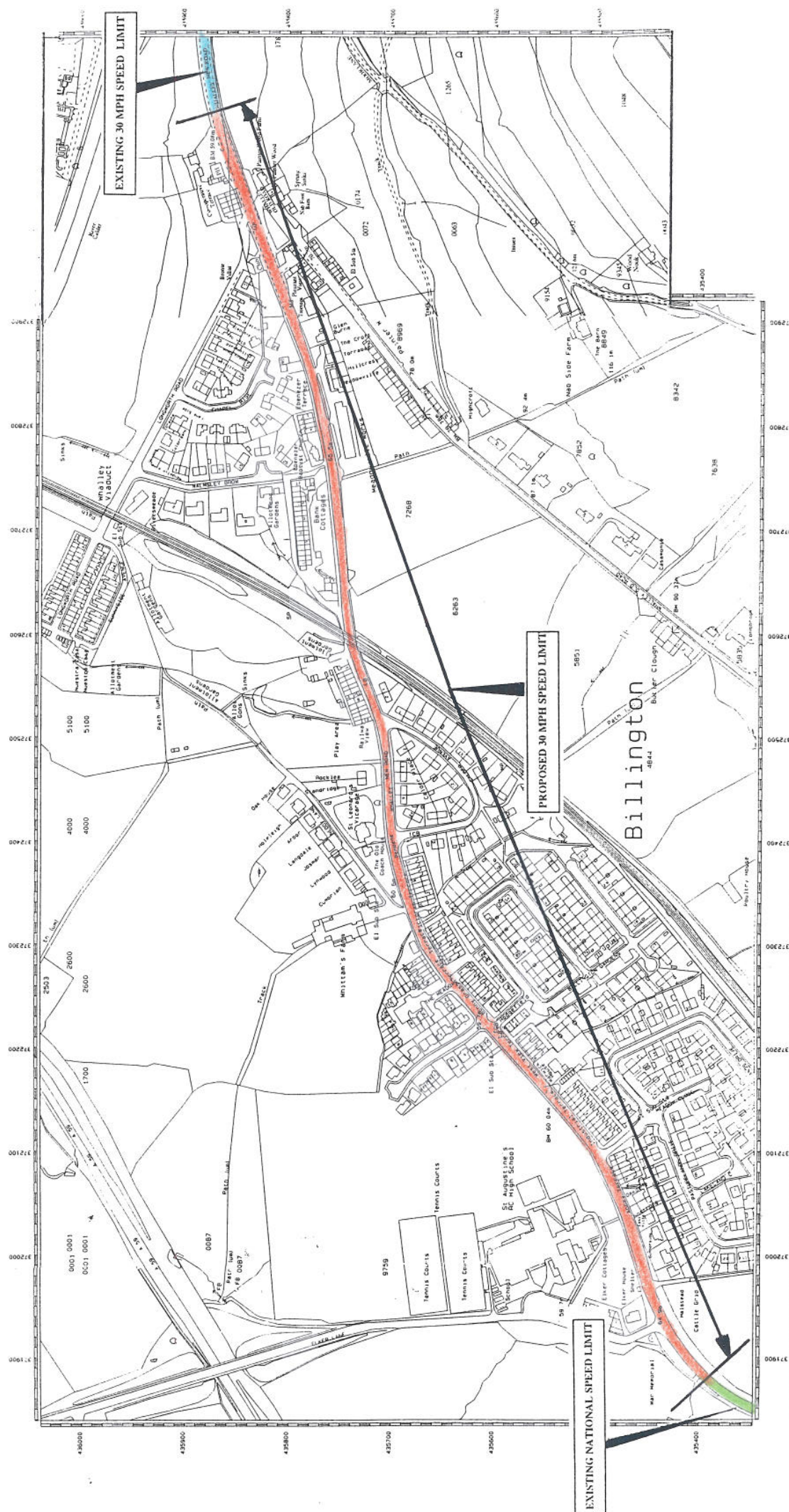
Whalley New Road, Billington, from a point 55 metres west of its junction with Elker Lane, to a point 75 metres east of Longworth Road, Whalley, a distance of approximately 1290 metres.
