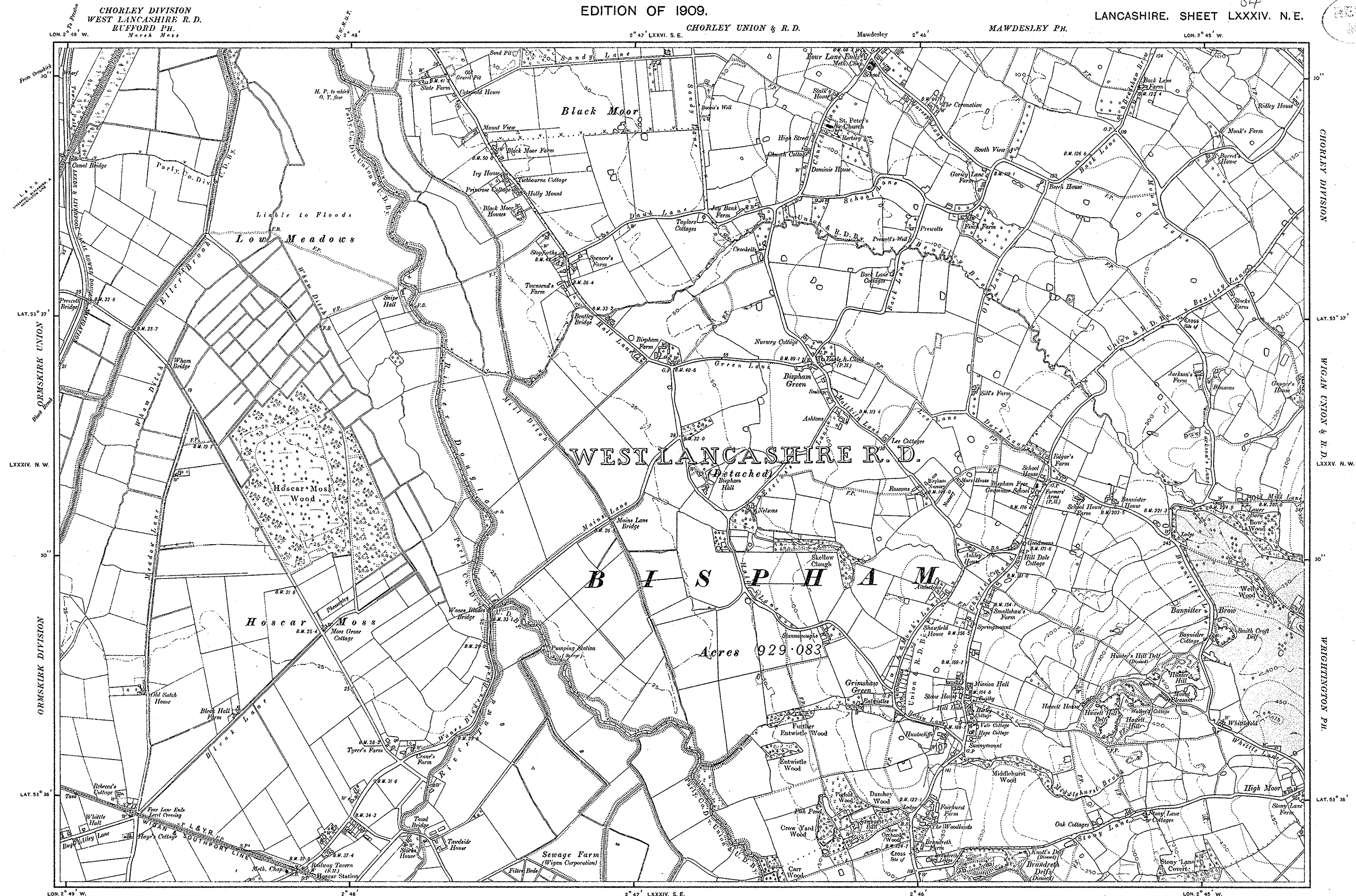

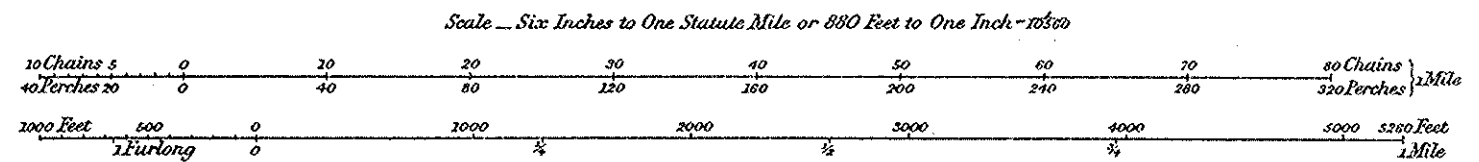

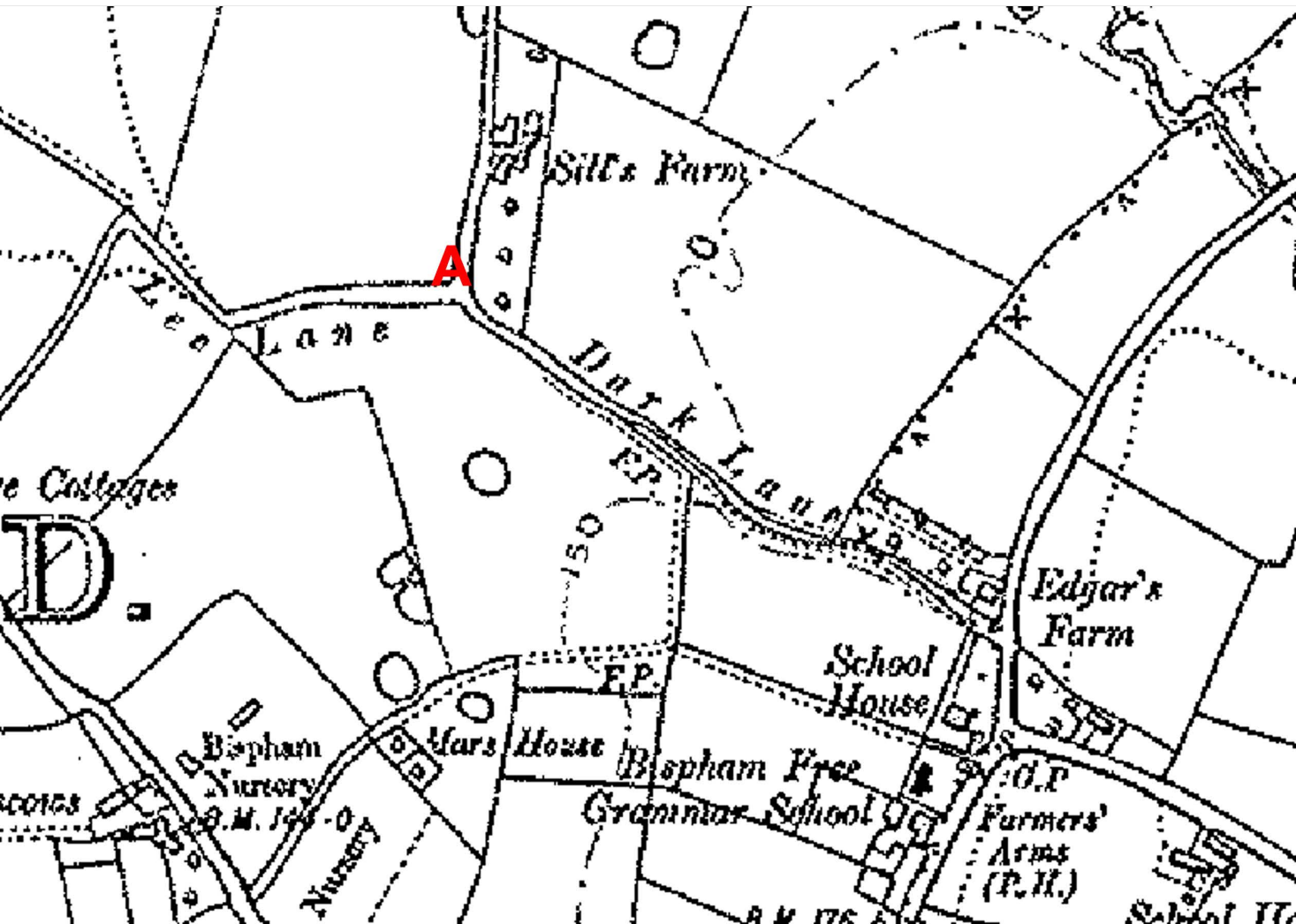

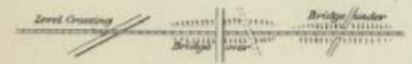
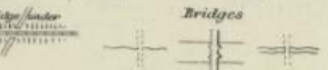

- Every parcel is numbered thus 27
- Its area is given underneath in Acres, thus 4.370
- Braces, indicating that the spaces so connected are included in the same reference number and area.

Six Inch Scale

The large figures under the Parish name thus **CLAUGHTON**
3785 2 4
represent its area in Acres, roods, & perches.

The Latitudes are given on the margin to every 30 seconds, & the Longitudes to every minute.

Leveling

The Altitudes are above the mean level of the Sea, at Liverpool.

The Contour altitudes are written thus 200

All other altitudes along roads, and to Trig^l Stations, obtained by Spirit Levelling are written thus 300 (Six Inch Scale), 300 (1/2500 Scale), the dot or cross showing the spot at which the altitude is taken.

The altitudes with the letters B.M. marked against them, refer to marks made on Buildings, Walls, Milestones &c.

The altitudes at the Trig^l Stations are given of the surface of the ground & also of the upper side of the centre stone marking the Station.
