(BERRY LANE AND MERSEY STREET, LONGRIDGE, RIBBLE VALLEY)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC) ORDER 2026

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council have made an Order under **Section 14(1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic on the roads set out in this notice.

1. No person shall cause any motor vehicle to proceed over that length of Berry Lane and Mersey Street Longridge as follows:
Berry Lane - from its junction with Mersey Street travelling in either direction for approximately 15 metres.
Mersey Street – from its junction with Berry Lane travelling in a north easterly direction for approximately 5 metres.
2. Nothing in this order shall apply to persons engaged in the carrying out of the works.
3. The prohibition will be operative from 19:00 hours on 1st September 2026 until 04:00 hours on 2nd September 2026 or until completion of the works within this period.
4. Vehicular access for residents will be maintained whenever and wherever possible. Pedestrian access to properties will always be maintained. Access will be maintained for emergency services.
5. An alternative route for vehicular traffic affected by the closure is via: -

Diversion 1 – Kestor Lane – Derby Street

Diversion 2 – Higher Road – King Street

The temporary prohibition is necessary to allow the installation of a flow monitor in a carriageway chamber.
